





## <u>INDUSTRY OVERVIEW</u>

The manufacturing industry, with its diverse activities from raw material acquisition to product completion, is a dynamic sector. It constantly evolves, propelled by technological advancements, shifts in consumer preferences, and global market dynamics. However, despite its growth potential, there's a notable disparity in the workforce. While an average area of comparable size would employ 191,411 individuals, our region only has 149,415 workers. This shortfall could pose challenges in finding suitable candidates. Moreover, projections indicate that this gap between expected and actual employment levels is likely to persist over the next five years.








